To date the Foundation has awarded over \$8 million to worthy causes.

In partnership with the City of Coral Gables, the Coral Gables Community Foundation offers The Commemorative Bench Program. The program provides a meaningful way for people, nonprofit organizations, and companies to honor the legacy of a loved one, a special milestone, or commemorate an event with a bench in one of the City's green spaces or parks.

Within your preferred park or in one of the City's beautiful green spaces, a brand new bench will be installed with a plaque. These commemorative benches are 6 feet long, UV and moisture resistant and have an estimated 15-year lifetime.

Individuals, families and non-profit organizations: \$1,700 Corporate Rate: \$3,500

The cost of the commemorative bench is tax deductible. Pricing includes the bench, installation and the plaque.






2019 Fund Disbursements
